WSU BOARD OF GOVERNORS APPROVES CREATION OF PROFESSIONAL DOCTORATE PROGRAM

The Wayne State University Board of Governors has approved the establishment of a Professional Doctorate in Medical Physics (DMP) effective for the Fall 2016 term. The proposal was submitted to the university last fall and approved by Board of Governors in April of this year. We anticipate submitting our proposal for CAMPEP accreditation for this program as soon as we admit our first student.



The shortage of accredited clinical residency programs in Medical Physics is well documented. The creation of the DMP Program in Medical Physics is one potential solution to this shortage. Three DMP programs are already accredited by CAMPEP and several more are in the process of creation, implementation, or accreditation. We anticipate that this program will not only fulfill an important clinical need, but will also keep the WSU graduate program competitive for the top prospective students.

The DMP consists of 90 credits and includes all required MS courses, 12 credits of directed research, 14 additional didactic credits, and 30 clinical credits representing 2 years of clinical training which are identical to our accredited residency program. In addition, our Distinguished Alumnus Award will be presented to this year's selected winner! All in all, we look forward to a good time with great people!


We will soon send out an Invite and RSVP email to all alumni to help us make arrangements. We hope you to see you there.

American Association of Physicists in Medicine selects 26 Abstracts from WSU's Medical Physics Graduate Program

Wayne State University School of Medicine's Medical Physics Graduate Program will be well represented at this year's 58th annual meeting of the American Association of Physicists in Medicine, with 26 abstracts already accepted for presentation. The research involves nine faculty members in the Department of Oncology, fourteen students in the Medical Physics Graduate Program, two Radiation Oncology residents, and one Radiation Oncology Physics resident; representing a total of 13 oral presentations, 10 poster presentations, and 3 e-poster presentations. The large fraction of oral presentations this year is an indicator of the high quality of abstracts submitted from our program this year.
